# ISSHJ Multidisciplinary International Conference on Process and Achievement in Language Studies 28-29 April 2023

The notions of achievement and process have been at the heart of the academic debate. Research in language studies and language teaching practices have been investigated from both process and achievement perspectives. In this vein, the department of English at the Higher Institute of Human Sciences of Jendouba organizes an international conference to address the issues of Achievement and process and animate the debate.

The concepts of *Process and Achievement* are intertwined and interlinked. Ralph Waldo Emerson described achievements "as monuments which shall endure until the sun grows cold."<sup>1</sup> Achievements are the result of a process or a road map a person follows. The idea of achieving objectives is deeply anchored in human life through the long human journey. Moreover, researchers have been sharing their experiences and research results in all academic areas to develop better processes for the future.

Process and Achievement conference targets empirical, conceptual and methodological contributions that address these various strands to initiate a debate on the im/possibilities of achievement in relation to process. The conference seeks to highlight theoretical and practical aspects which would contribute to an understanding of the relationship between both concepts, process and achievement, by questioning, reconceptualizing, reinventing, revisiting, and reinvigorating them in academic studies. Social sciences like anthropology, sociology, and psychology have equally lent attention to process and achievement through which social groups can operate. Hence, the educational achievements of students and their academic careers represent an important issue today, especially in the university-to-work transition.

The conference welcomes papers, poster sessions, and workshops in the fields of literature, linguistics, arts, humanities, culture studies, and translation that examine the dimensions in
